Since 1980, Harford Glen Environmental Education Center has offered a unique experience to Harford County Public School's fifth grade students. The two and a half day residential program allows students and teachers the opportunity to be immersed in environmental education. Using the theme of Environmental Stewardship, fifth graders learn about the world they live in and their role in protecting, conserving and improving natural resources. Upon returning to schools, students apply what they've learned to design and implement a schoolyard habitat project.

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Wetland Ecology

In tidal wetlands and floodplain forest students use global positioning systems technology (GPS) to locate the sampling sites. At each site, students will collect sediment samples for analysis in the classroom. This data will then be compared to SAV/EAV growth to determine if a relationship exists.



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
