Maryland Center for School Safety Leads Statewide School-Based Incident Tabletop Exercise to Enhance Emergency Preparedness

Baltimore, MD – On May 10th, 2024, the Maryland Center for School Safety (MCSS) spearheaded an in-depth tabletop exercise (TTX) to test emergency preparedness and response capabilities across the state. The TTX, facilitated by MCSS, simulated an active assailant event to test the coordination and effectiveness of response efforts. Local Education Agencies (LEAs) engaged in dynamic discussions and scenario-based simulations designed to identify strengths, challenges, and opportunities for improvement in emergency response protocols.

"The statewide TTX marks a significant milestone as the first school-based event of its kind conducted across Maryland. Testing emergency plans is vital to preparing for emergencies," said Kate Bryan, Executive Director of the MCSS. "Through this event, each LEA had the unique opportunity to uncover specialized needs, resource gaps, and areas for improvement within their emergency preparedness plans. This exercise has allowed us to gain valuable insight into how we can better support each LEA from a statewide level, ensuring a more comprehensive and coordinated approach to school safety. We deeply appreciate the participation, expertise, and collaboration of our local partners who serve our public schools and communities."
