From the Governor of the State of Maryland

WEIGHTS AND MEASURES WEEK MARCH 1-7, 2021

- WHEREAS,** *Weights and measures play a vital and necessary role in society, because everyone who enters into an economic transaction uses some form of measurement; and*
- WHEREAS,** *Weights and Measures inspectors keeping pace with rapidly advancing technologies to ensure fairness in the marketplace; and*
- WHEREAS,** *The Weights and Measures Section of the Maryland Department of Agriculture works daily to protect our consumers by testing the accuracy of gasoline pumps, meters used to measure home fuel oil deliveries and thousands of scales - from grocery store scales to highway truck scales - providing an important service for people while directly contributing to the vitality and strength of Maryland's economy; and*
- WHEREAS,** *President John Adams signed the first federal Weights and Measures Law in the United States on March 2, 1799; and*
- WHEREAS,** *Maryland is pleased to join with the National Conference of Weights and Measures and the Maryland Department of Agriculture in celebrating a special week that recognizes the dedicated efforts of weights and measures officials in our communities - who maintain high quality standards, and who subsequently earn the tremendous respect and admiration of our public at-large.*
